<p>26-3.3</p>	<p>To report the Establishment of Research and Development Cell</p> <p>University Grant Commission has notified the guidelines for establishment of Research and Development Cell (R&D Cell) in Higher Education Institutions to promote quality research that contributes meaningfully towards the goal of a self-reliant India (“Atma-Nirbhar Bharat”), aligned with the provision of NEP-2020 [Annexure-B]. The establishment of Research and Development Cell in HEIs enables attainment of targets of Atma-Nirbhar Bharat and is expected to play a pivotal role in catalysing multidisciplinary/transdisciplinary and translational research culture mandated in NEP-2020.</p> <p>On the basis of the UGC Guidelines, University has established the R&D Cell and as resolved by the 50th Executive Council, Prof. L.M. Waghmare was appointed as Director (Research & Development) and joined.</p>

Earlier, University was having Research and Project Cell which was headed by Dean (Research), however, as per UGC Guidelines the cell is being renamed as Research and Development Cell and vide Office Order No. 1968 dated 05.09.2023, Director (R&D) has been entrusted with the responsibilities of the Research & Development Cell to oversee the portfolio related to promotion of research, Ph.D. Programs, and research project related tasks in accordance with the UGC guidelines for the establishment of Research & Development Cell in Higher Education institutions.

The objectives to establish the R&D Cell are as under:

1. To create an organizational structure with role-based functions of RDC, formulate Research Policy for the HEIs, identify thrust areas of research, and form related cluster groups/frontline teams/consortia of researchers.
2. To create enabling provisions in Research Policies for recruitment of research personnel procurement of equipment, and financial management with adequate autonomy to the Principal Investigator(s) and disseminate research outcomes to stakeholders and the public at large.
3. To establish a special purpose vehicle to promote researchers and innovators, identify potential collaborators from industry, research organizations, academic institutions & other stakeholders for cooperation and synergistic partnerships.
4. To act as a liaison between researchers & relevant research funding agencies, extend guidance in preparation & submission of project proposals and post-sanctioning of the grants to oversee adherence to timelines.
5. To have better coordination among other cells/centers dealing with University-Industry Inter Linkage, Incubation, Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development and Intellectual Property Rights (IPR).
6. To develop an Institutional Research Information System for sharing the status of on-going/completed research projects/Programmes, expertise & resources, etc., making effective use of Information & Communication Technology (ICT) for preparing the database of in-house experts to provide industrial consultancy and services.
7. To engage & utilize the services of superannuated active faculty/scientists in research capacity building of talented young minds and promote mobility of researchers across institutions and R&D Labs.
8. To serve as nodal center for ideation and conceptualization of research topics/themes by organizing workshops and training programs and ensuring the integrity and ethical practices in research activities including clearance of bioethical committee wherever required.

26-3.11 To report the provisional promotion of Integrated / B. Tech. Programme (Batch 2021) 1st Year students

It is to mention that during End Semester Examination May, 2022 of M.Sc. Integrated (5 year) and B.Tech. (Batch 2021) 1st semester students, 118 out 190 students were failed in PHY101 (Mechanics) and 105 out of 121 students were failed in MAT102 (Mathematics-I). The matter was submitted to Hon'ble Vice Chancellor on 03/11/2022 and comments from respective HoDs and Deans were asked for next course of action.

On receipt of comments from HoDs and Dean, a moderation committee was constituted by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to review the result of these courses. The Committee recommended to conduct the special classes for said courses and students may be allowed to register for back paper in the next opportunity. Accordingly, result of 1st semester was declared on 31.01.2023 and subsequently result of ESE 2nd semester held in October 2022 was also declared on 03/02/2023.

On declaration of both the results, 89 students were not promoted in 2nd year as the students has not earned 70% of credit taking into consideration both odd and even semester, which is an essential requirement for promotion from even to odd semester.

Grievances from these students were received to reconsider the case. Accordingly, a meeting of Deans and HoDs was called on 13.03.2023 to discuss the matter. It was resolved in the meeting that the students who has already appeared in the ESE of May and October 2022 (Odd & Even) may be provisionally promoted to next odd semester. However, all such students are required to clear the minimum of 70% of the total credits in all four semesters to be eligible to get promoted to next odd semester.

Further it was also decided to not to take this case as precedence in future.

Placed before the Academic Council for information and ratification.

Discussion: While deliberation a matter of condonation of short attendance i.e. less than 75% was brought up. Chairman opined that while University is already giving relaxation of 25% to the all students, what is the logic for further relaxation of 10% i.e. 5% by Deans and 5% by Vice Chancellor. Various pros and cons of the matter was discussed, however matter could not lead to any concrete conclusion

Resolution: The agenda item was noted and ratified. Further, it was resolved to appoint a committee to review the attendance relaxation policy and the recommendation may be discussed in the next Academic Council.

As University has also got "Category-I University" status by the University Grant Commission and as per the University Grants Commission (Categorization of Universities (only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations, 2018 "Universities may start a new course/programme/department/school/centre in disciplines that form a part of its existing academic framework without approval of the UGC, provided no demand for fund is made from the government on account of starting the new course / programme / department / school / centre."

Accordingly, in case approval is not received from UGC, University would like to commence these courses in self-financing mode.

Placed before the Academic Council for consideration.

Resolution: Approved the proposal to start the following programmes:

1. B.Sc. Hotel Management & Catering Technology
2. B.Sc. Cardiology
3. M.Sc. Neuroscience
4. M.Sc. Medical Laboratory Technology

It was also resolved that the Hostel will be provided to the students as per availability, otherwise students have to make their own arrangements.

The DRC of the scholar is to be re-constituted as one of the DRC member has withdrawal his name from the DRC. Further, School Board Meeting is also not planned in the School. Being an golden opportunity for the Scholar and also the prestigious moment for University, the matter is being placed in the Academic Council as a special case.

The syllabi for Education, Arts, Language, Muscic, Sports and Yoga were adopted as per the syllabi prescribed by NCTE.

It was reported and resolved in both BOS and SB and subsequent suggestions were given to adopt the syllabi.

III. To consider changing the nomenclature of the M.Sc-B.Ed. (Innovative)

Discussion

Till date the nomenclature of the ongoing three years duration programme was M.Sc.-B.Ed. (integrative).

The Department of Education continues to receive emails requesting to change the existing MSc-BEd (integrated) to MSc-BEd (innovative).

Because there is a disparity between integrated and innovative, many of our students are being rejected to appear the interviews in KV and state sponsored senior secondary schools.

Resolution

To avoid further confusion it was resolved to align the existing, with the nomenclature of NCTE. Therefore approval was given to change the nomenclature as MSc-BEd (Innovative) instead of MSc-BEd (integrated).

IV. To consider 30 as the intake of MSc Yoga therapy

Discussion

Since the department has a lack of infrastructure to accommodate 40 students together, it was proposed to restrict the number of students to 30.

Resolution

It was discussed in both BOS and SB and suggestions were given to restrict the number to 30.

Placed before the Academic Council for consideration.

Resolution: The proposal at S.No. I for changing the eligibility of MA in Education approved with Bachelor's degree in any Arts, Science and Commerce with a minimum of 50% for the General Category and 45% in OBC/ST/SC/ EWS category.
